Flying to the village and checking Acts

Our whole family flew by helicopter to Hamelengan village for four weeks in June and July. Our main goal was to check as much of the translation of Acts as we could, in preparation for the final consultant check later this year. We didn't expect to finish all the checking during this stay, since the Nukna people are all very busy at this time of year clearing land and planting new gardens. But, by the grace of God, we were able to go through the entire book of Acts twice with groups of Nukna villagers, checking for accuracy and comprehension. The Nukna people were eager to meet with us to do this work, even with all the other work they needed to do. One strategy that helped us finish

was to work at night. The people could still plant their gardens by day, while checking the book of Acts by night. We would often work late into the night - one night until nearly 1 a.m. Good thing God made me (Matt) a night owl!

While in Hamelengan village, Christy had the opportunity to teach the Nukna women how to make banana bread. Not only did they pick up some new skills, but it was also a great relationship building time!

Thank you for your prayers while we were in the village. Everyone in our family stayed healthy, and we enjoyed some relatively dry weather for a change, allowing us to get out of the house and enjoy the outdoors.

When we returned to Ukarumpa in mid-July, Christy resumed working as receptionist at the health clinic here in Ukarumpa, while I began doing exegetical checking of the first drafts of Philippians and I & II Thessalonians. I also just finished another round of the Executive Committee meetings for our PNG branch.

Please keep Christy in your prayers, as she has just left PNG to spend time with her parents in California for about four weeks. Her mom has been having health issues. Matt has remained in Ukarampa, working on translation and taking care of the kids.
